"OUR DAUGHTER'S BEDROOM

WAS in a very bad state when we bought the apartment. The walls had a dated finish, the cupboards were old and the carpets dark and dreary," says homeowner Terrence Naidoo (pictured above with his wife Shamala and decorator Kimberley Richmond of Beautiful Spaces). "The colour scheme was also boring and unsuitable for a young woman."

HOW THIS SPACE WENT FROM DRAB TO FAB: The Naidoos enlisted the help of Kimberley to turn it into a five-star bedroom. "We recently moved to the Cape and I wanted to create a home my family would love," says Terrence. "My daughter loves lilac and wanted this in her bedroom."

"Lilac can be a tricky colour, so I suggested we incorporate it subtly," says Kimberley. "First, we skimmed the walls to remove the stipple finish. Bates Master Painters & Decorators painted the walls and ceilings white to open up the room."

Good lighting was important, so bulkheads were added around the

perimeter of the ceiling to incorporate downlights. The carpeting was replaced with a light oak vinyl flooring from Mazista.

"To bring in the requested colour, I designed a subtle lilac and white patterned wallpaper. I also introduced reflective surfaces where possible to give the illusion of space. Magenta-coloured glass panels the width of the side tables were installed floor to ceiling to pick up the colour of the fabrics."

"NOW THE BEDROOM IS simply stunning! My daughter is thrilled with her new room and it suits her style and personality," says Terrence.
